The Nebraska Brand Committee agrees to inspect all <u>cattle</u> originating from within the South Dakota Brand Inspection Area, consigned to the markets and slaughter plants listed herein, and to charge and collect the inspection fee as set by the Nebraska Brand Committee. The fees collected shall be retained by the Nebraska Brand Committee.

The Nebraska Brand Committee agrees to hold the proceeds from sale of any South Dakota <u>cattle</u> arriving at the Inspection Points listed above without a Shipper's Permit. They also agree to hold the proceeds from the sale of South Dakota <u>cattle</u> originating from the brand inspection area until proof of ownership is established by the seller. These proceeds may be held for-up to 60 days at the market. If ownership to the <u>cattle</u> cannot be established within this period of time, the net proceeds from the sale, along with all paper work, stray remittance report, tally, sales sheet, etc., will be sent to the Chief Brand Inspector, South Dakota State Brand Board.

The Nebraska Brand Inspector will contact the South Dakota State Brand Board Chief Brand Inspector, of any <u>cattle</u> consignments to which ownership is questioned and handle such consignments as directed.

Both parties agree to supply each other at no cost, with current Electronic Brand Books and additions thereto, as well as other forms deemed necessary to perform and report livestock inspection within these states.

Each party specifically reserves any claims it may have to sovereign immunity as a defense to any action arising in conjunction with this agreement and nothing herein shall be as a waiver of immunity.

This agreement represents the entire and integrated agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations and agreements whether written or oral.

This agreement shall become effective July 1, 2021 for a period-of one year- The agreement will be automatically renewed for additional periods absent notice of termination, This agreement will terminate

upon 60 days written notice by any party, to the other parties. agreement may be amended upon mutual agreement of the parties, in writing.

ASSESSMENT COLLECTION AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and effective as of the 1st of January 2023, through the 31st of December, 2023 ("Term") by and between:

Nebraska Brand Committee P.O. Box I Alliance, Nebraska 69301 ("NBC") and

Nebraska Beef Council P.O. Box 2108 Kearney, Nebraska 68848 ("COUNCIL").

<u>Recitals</u>

Neb.Rev.Stat. §54-195 allows NBC to contract to collect assessments made by any public, quasi-public, or private agency or organization on the sale of cattle, beef and beef products in Nebraska by producers and importers of such cattle, beef and beef products ("Assessments") and to charge an administrative fee not to exceed five percent (5%) of the assessments collected.

The COUNCIL is a private agency or organization formed for the purpose, and charged with the duty, of making and collecting Assessments in Nebraska.

FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL CONVENANTS HEREIN CONTAINED, the parties agree as follows:

1. NBC DUTIES: NBC agrees to:

- a. During the term of this Agreement collect, on behalf of COUNCIL, said Assessments, which Assessments collected <u>SHALL</u> be in the form of a check or other electronic forms of payment and shall be made payable to COUNCIL;
- b. Complete whatever transmittal forms are provided to it by COUNCIL and which are reasonable and necessary to support the Assessments collected;
- c. On the first business day of each week, or more often as determined by NBC, deliver to COUNCIL all Assessments, together with all transmittal forms, collected or received by NBC during the immediately preceding week;

- Accept the amount to be paid to NBC by COUNCIL pursuant to Paragraph 2 of this
 Agreement in full payment for all of its services rendered to COUNCIL pursuant to this
 Agreement and Nebraska law;
- e. To keep accurate records, books, and documents involving transactions under this Agreement and to make all such records available upon request to representatives of COUNCIL or the Secretary for inspection and/or audit during the Term and retain the records, books, and documents for a period of not less than three (3) years after termination of this Agreement. NBC and all subcontractors subject to Section f below, shall receive reasonable notice of audits and such audits shall be conducted during normal business hours.
- f. That all deliverables must be reviewed by USDA/AMS, which oversees NBC, prior to use. NBC agrees that under no circumstances will deliverables be released to any party other than NBC without USDA/AMS approval; and
- g. No Assessments collected by NBC under this Agreement will be used for the purpose of influencing legislative and/or influencing government policy or action and must be spent on activities in accordance with the Beef Promotion and Research Act of 1985 and the Beef Promotion and Research Order.

2. COUNCIL DUTIES: COUNCIL agrees to:

- a. On or before the fifteenth day of each month, COUNCIL shall pay to NBC, at its address set forth above, a sum equal to five percent (5%) of the total of the Assessments delivered by the NBC to COUNCIL during the immediately preceding month; and
- b. COUNCIL shall provide, at COUNCIL's expense, proper transmittal forms necessary to support the Assessments collection to be made by NBC.
- 3. <u>PRIVATE TREATY</u>: NBC shall only be obligated to collect the Assessments on all <u>PRIVATE TREATY</u> sales of cattle which occur within the <u>BRAND INSPECTION AREA</u> (as defined by Nebraska law). NBC shall have no obligation to collect Assessments on sales through auction markets or packing plants or outside of the BRAND INSPECTION AREA.
- 4. <u>TERM</u>: The Term of this Agreement, unless sooner terminated as provided in Paragraph 7, shall be from January 1, 2023 to December 31, 2023, and if not renewed within sixty days before the end of the term, this Agreement shall expire and the parties shall have no further obligations hereunder except for the delivery by NBC to COUNCIL of all Assessments and transmittal forms in its possession and the payment by COUNCIL to NBC of any unpaid amounts pursuant to Paragraph 2.
- 5. LIABILITY: NBC shall have no liability to COUNCIL, or anyone else, for uncollected Assessments.
- 6. <u>INDEMNITY</u>: COUNCIL indemnifies and holds NBC harmless against loss, including attorney fees, from any and every claim and demand of every kind and character, which may be asserted by anyone by reason of NBC collecting Assessments for COUNCIL as provided for herein, NBC's, its agents' and employees' negligence excepted.

7.	TERMINATION: COUNCIL and the Secretary of Agriculture ("Secretary") reserve the right, at
	their own discretion and for any reason deemed by them to be sufficient, to terminate or modify
	the contract and be relieved of payment after the date of execution. In such event, it is agreed
	that COUNCIL is liable for all commitments made prior to cancellation or modification and shall
	reimburse NBC for all reasonable amounts due or owing in accordance with this Agreement at
	the time of said termination.

NBC may terminate this Agreement at any time for any reason by giving COUNCIL notice of termination in writing at least sixty days before the date of termination.

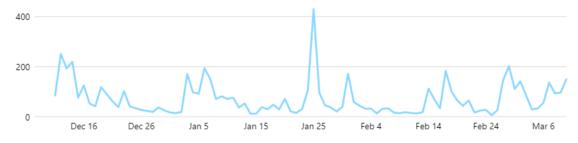
